



The pages of this pack give some general information about elephants and some fun and engaging activities to foster and develop children's interest in them.

This pack includes:


- Fact posters x3 (Could be used as stimuli for a lesson input)

- Multimats x4 (for Colouring/Art & Craft/Loose Parts/Playdough)







