Scots Pine



Height: 35m


Leaf: Green needles - slightly twisted.

Fact:

- Evergreen.
- Trees can live for 700 years.

Horse Chestnut



Height: 40m

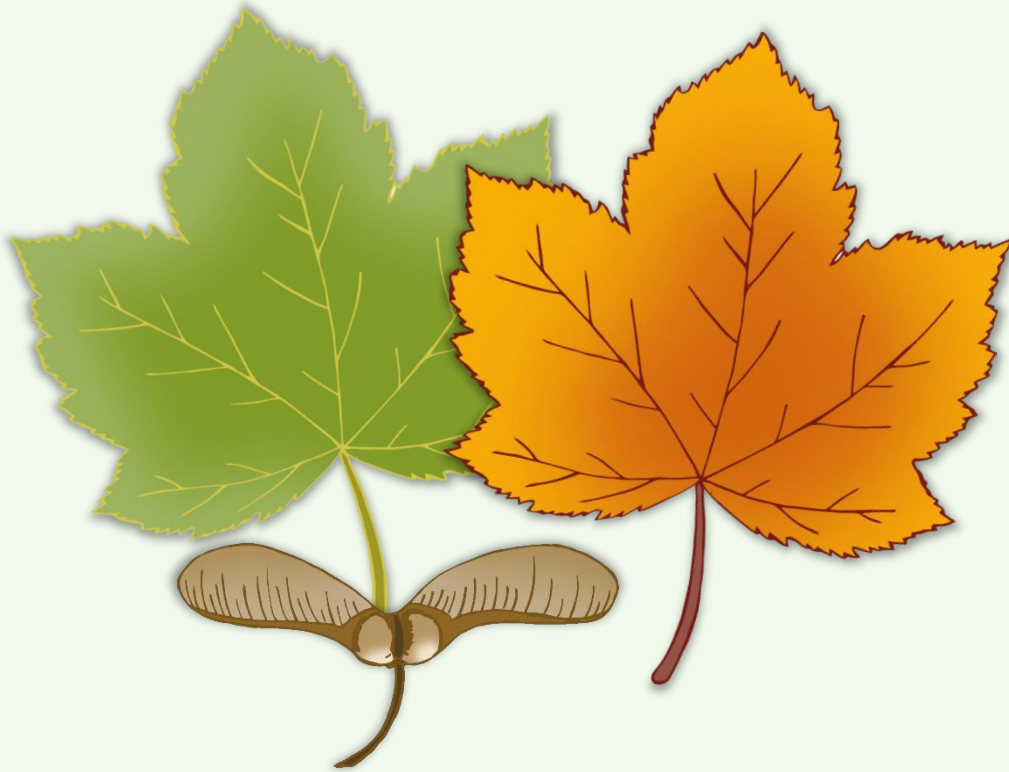
Leaf: Each leaf has 5-7 leaflets.

Fact:

- Produces conkers.
- Trees can live 300 years.

Sycamore



Height:

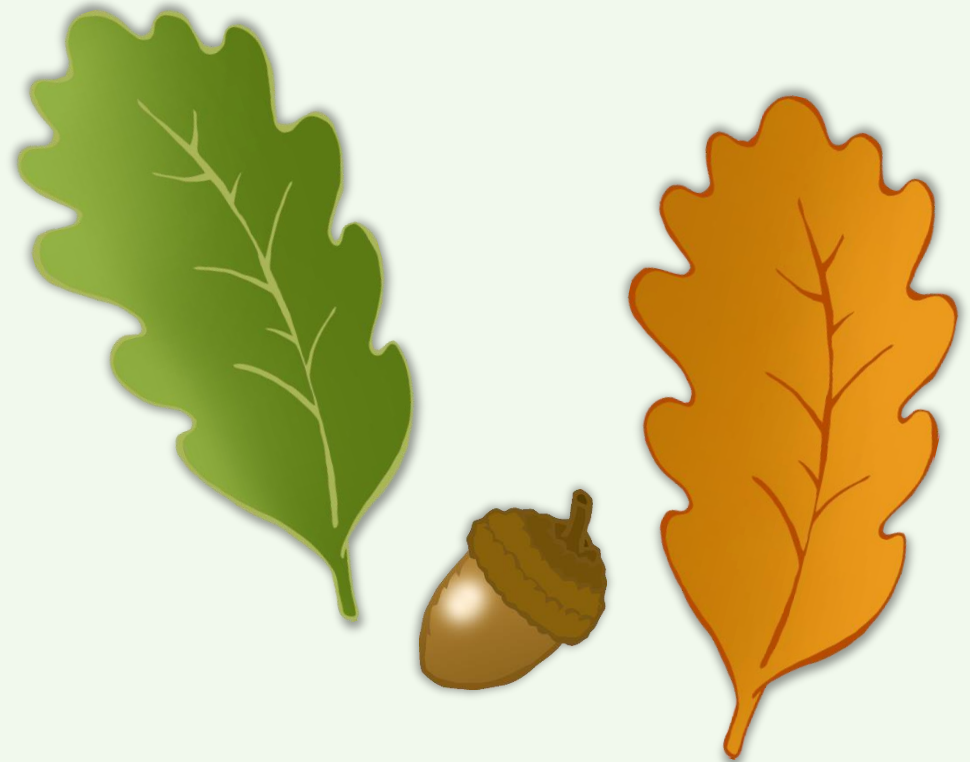
35m

Leaf:

Up to 16cm long
with five lobes.

Fact: Produces sycamore seeds that have fall slowly to the floor in a slow spinning motion.

Oak



Height:

20-40m

Leaf:

Up to 10cm long with
four to five lobes.

Fact:

Produces acorns.

Horse Chestnut



Height:

40m

Leaf:

Each leaf has
5-7 leaflets.

Fact:

- Produces conkers.
- Trees can live 300 years.

Beech



Height:

40m

Leaf:

Up to 9cm long.

Fact:

Beech trees don't drop their
leaves when they turn brown.

Ash



Height:

35m

Leaf:

Up to 40cm long.

Fact:

Leaves fall when they are still green.

Scots Pine



Height:

35m

Leaf:

Green needles – slightly twisted.

Fact:

- Evergreen.
- Trees can live for 700 years.

Western Hemlock



Height:

45m

Leaf:

Soft, flat
needles.

Fact:

Evergreen.

London Plane



Height:

35m

Leaf:

Up to 20cm long.

Fact:

Trees can live for over
300 years.

Black Poplar



Height:
30m

Leaf: Shiny, green and heart-shaped.

Fact: Trees can live for over 200 years.

Holly



Height:
15m

Leaf: Leaves are spiky when the tree is young, but smoother when the tree is old.

Fact:

- Evergreen.
- Trees can live for 300 years.
